# How AFIX Visits Enhanced The NYSDOH Immunization Registry (NYSIIS) In Suffolk County, NY Mary Koslap-Petraco, DNP, PNP-BC, CPNP



# Background

- The New York State law implementing the Immunization Registry (NYSIIS) went into effect in Suffolk County, NY on 1/1/08
- Since its inception it has been an ongoing struggle to have private providers fully comply with data entry of all vaccine records, especially history.
- Staffing issues is the reason cited most often for lack of compliance
- Other private practices have not implemented computer systems that have internet access
- Some practices believe that entering immunizations into NYSIIS amounts to double charting
- Yet other practices are entering only the vaccines that they have administered, leaving out any vaccine history they have obtained
- Lack of immunization history and incomplete records decreases the usefulness of NYSIIS.

### Population

- Suffolk County is a suburban county in NY with a population of 1.4 million people
- Census data from 2009 revealed that 314,600 children 18 years of age and younger reside in the county
- All of these children should be entered into NYSIIS
- About 30 private providers in Suffolk County have not yet made any attempt to participate in NYSIIS
- Additionally, influenza vaccine doses administered to adults at Public Health Influenza clinics are entered into NYSIIS

# Setting

- There are currently over 300 practicing pediatricians and family practice providers in Suffolk County
- 8 community health centers run by SCDHS
- All are mandated by NYS law to enter all immunizations administered to children from birth through 18 years of age as well as immunization histories
- There are 238 providers who participate in the Vaccines for Children Program (VFC).

#### **Project Description**

- SCDHS staff began to utilize the registry to conduct AFIX assessments
- The data found in the registry was far below what was needed to conduct the AFIX indicating less than optimal compliance
- AFIX assessments are mandatory for VFC providers
- Providers' offices were called and asked to fax immunization records to our office for inclusion in the AFIX
- The SCDHS staff offered to enter all of the missing immunization data into the registry for the providers thereby improving the accuracy of the registry
- This procedure actually made it easier for staff since they did not have to travel to private providers' office to complete the AFIX data entry
- Errors found in registry were also corrected
- The post assessment results were faxed to the provider, and were followed up with in person visits
- Any additional questions raised following post assessment visits were discussed via conference call with the staff
- Letters to practices that still have not complied with NYSIIS have been mailed by NYSDOH
  - SCDHS staff is following up to ask these practices if they will fax a sample of immunization records to be entered into NYSIIS





#### Results/Lessons Learned

**Private providers** were delighted to have a sizable portion of their **records** entered into the registry

Their staff time was saved and the usefulness of the registry was increased

Once usefulness of NYSIIS was increased, private providers were more likely to continue to enter data on their own

Accuracy of NYSIIS was improved

**NYSDOH** has used this model to suggest that other counties enter private providers' immunization data into the registry as part of AFIX assessments
